

Parking Rules

You must bring your vehicle registration to student registration in order to obtain your hang tag.

- A. Hang tags are sold at registration for \$75 to any eligible junior/senior for parking in the student lot. Each parking permit will be numbered. Replacement hang tags will be an additional \$25; and **only one replacement hang tag will be issued during a school year.**
- B. Parking is a privilege - not a right. Students will have hang tags withdrawn and driving privileges revoked without a refund if they are found guilty of:
- Receiving a second suspension for any reason (including truancy).
 - Any misbehavior in the parking lot
 - Any violation of Seaholm's drug/alcohol policy.
 - Any accident caused by recklessness or violation of traffic regulations.
 - NOTE: Use of the lot without a hang tag will result in 4 or more hours of detention for illegal parking. Freshmen or sophomores using a permit without permission or parking without a permit will lose the privilege of obtaining a permit the following year.
- C. A Parking Appeals Court consisting of two teachers, two students and a non-involved administrator will rule on any appeals of this policy.
- D. The hang tag must be placed on the mirror of the windshield so that it is clearly visible from the front of the vehicle. **A car will be ticketed if there is no hang tag visible and affixed to the mirror of the windshield.** Students must park only in designated areas and must NOT use more than one space. Students must observe the 10 mph speed limit, all parking signs and not park on the sidewalks, lawns or in handicapped zones.
- E. During the school day, the Cranbrook lot is the ONLY lot for junior/senior parking, and permits are mandatory. There is no parking in front of the school on Lincoln. The Community Education lot is restricted to staff and visitor use only. More hang tags are sold than there are parking spaces. The hang tag gives permission to park **if there are spaces available.**
- F. A driver with a permit will lose his/her permit if he/she transports freshman and/or sophomore students to lunch.
